- ♣ Update from BJ Cook: Many of you have asked how I have been doing since I retired in January and going through my chemo treatment. So far things have been going well. I just finished up my 11th week of a 16 week my current chemo treatment. My numbers are looking good where it looks like I will be going through with my stem cell transplant later in May.

I had my initial meeting with the stem cell transplant team on March 15 at the Lemmen-Holton Cancer Pavilion and even though I don't have an exact date yet, I do have an update. (over)

Prayer Connection Continued...

After I finish up the 16th weeks of my current chemo treatment I will have another bone marrow biopsy so they have a base line of where I am at before the stem cell transplant. Once the biopsy has been completed, they said it would be a couple of weeks before the actual stem cell transplant procedure, which should be either the third or fourth week in May. Once admitted to the hospital down at Corewell Health (Spectrum Butterworth Hospital) in Grand Rapids, they said I would be there anywhere between two to three weeks recovering from the procedure. After I get out of the hospital in mid-June, I will come home and Sue will be my caregiver for two to four weeks and then hopefully she can go back to work after that. We will see if she can work here from home or eventually go back to the Big Rapids campus. Time will tell.

They say that the 100 day mark is the next goal to hit for not getting any infections/colds/flu or any other viruses. This will require isolation. Then at approximately the 6 month mark (post-transplant), I will start getting all my vaccines again since all childhood vaccines and immunities will be wiped out during the stem cell transplant. I am hoping to be able to get out in small crowds around November/December. This summer will be pretty much shot for me doing too many things around the house, but I'm looking forward to 2024 as being a "great" year where I can get back to my woodworking and really enjoy my retirement.

I want to thank all of you at Highland for your thoughts and prayers during this time and for the many cards I have received. Even though I may have one or two bad days a week, most of the time I'm doing well and still getting things done in my workshop while going through my current chemo treatment.
