Pastor Search Team Update from August 25 Meeting:

Previously we filtered a denominational list of pastor profiles to fit our setting: American, Midwest, lead pastor, mid-sized congregation etc. There were over 125 profiles on that filtered list. To this list we added suggestions mentioned directly to our team.

Next we sent an email note to each of them. We noted that they had come to our attention; we briefly introduced Highland Church; and we asked if they were open to further contact. Over a dozen replied to say they were open.

At our latest meeting the search team reviewed that "open" list. We trimmed it down to seven profiles we thought could be a match for Highland. Three search team members were assigned to look more thoroughly at each of those seven: reading their profile and watching videos of their worship leadership and preaching.

Our next meeting is scheduled for September 8. Each of the seven will be assessed. Our aim is to arrive at a short list of names to interview and check references. Please continue to pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance and our discernment.

Mark Manuscript Study- Join us for an innovative approach to Bible study that gets closer to the original biblical manuscript. Just as ancient manuscripts are carefully studied, so we want to carefully study Mark's account of Jesus. The gospel is laid out with 8 x11 sheets, wide margins and double-spaced lines and no chapter headings or verses. The manuscript study includes individual study, sharing observations and questions around a table of four, and then probing key themes with the whole group. Seven sessions are planned. Pastor Neil will serve as the group leader. Ultimately this study aims to provide a close up encounter with Jesus.

- WHEN: Starting September 19 each Sunday; 4:30 6:00 pm (Optional potluck at 6:00 pm. **We will skip September 26 (Highland ORV ride) and October 24.
- WHO: Everyone age 16 and older is welcome to participate.
- **NOTE:** Participation requires regular attendance. For continuity's sake, people should be able to attend at least five of the seven sessions.
