HIGHLAND COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS:

September 13, 2021

- 1. Received brief written reports from most of the seven main ministry teams.
- 2. Arrived at nominations for elders and deacon to serve on council the next two years.
- 3. Approved a proposal to blend voting with lots in electing elders and deacons.

Grounds:

- a. This honors the presence of the Holy Spirit in every believer to contribute to spiritual discernment in electing elders and deacons.
- b. Christian Reformed church order calls for a role for congregational voting in elections.
- c. This may motivate more people to attend the congregational meeting to have a voice.
- 4. Approved moving the congregational meeting from a Monday night to Sunday, November 21 after the worship hour. We hope this will allow more people to readily attend the meeting. No regular Sunday school classes will be held; rather the superintendent will plan for activities for the kids while parents are free to attend the meeting.
- 5. Decided to address the issue of women serving on council- as elders and deacons- starting late this year. The issue has come to the forefront with our pastor search process seeking a male pastor. There was initial thought to address this next spring, three years after our prior congregational consideration and vote. However council deemed it best to address this issue a bit sooner for two reasons. First, it is on the minds of many now; so it is best to address it now. Second, this would allow our transitional pastor to give experienced leadership in a healthy process while he is still with us. It would not be best to put this on a new pastor soon after arriving at Highland.
