Pastor Mark is putting us in contact with them and is planning on going along with us. We have transportation lined up and a tentative schedule that we will be locking down soon. We will have more information each week along with ways that you can support us for the trip. It has been a while since we've done this so your prayers and support will be greatly appreciated. Middle School Catechism Students just completed a unit on justice. In our first lesson we learned that half of the world's population lives on less than \$2/day. We decided to do a "justice project" through World Renew- working to fix the problems causing poverty. Each student was given an envelope and asked to put money in it if they chose to and only if it was their own money. If they did not have money, they could ask parents/grandparents to pay them for specified work. They handed in envelopes without their names on them. Last Sunday we opened the envelopes and found that we had collected \$415! We used the World Renew catalog and voted to give The Farm Team which is a goat, pig, piglet, rabbit, duck, rooster, and chicken. This will give a family more food, and income to support themselves. We also gave a family-sized water filter and ten fruit trees. The money was sent to World Renew as a gift from the Highland CRC Middle School catechism class. The gifts will go to a family (families) in Uganda, Bangladesh, Honduras, Guatemala, or Haiti. The prayer is that these students will learn to "*Act justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with God.*" Micah 6:8 ~Marilyn Visser
