- **Playground Structure:** Council approved the proposal for new playground equipment to replace the south structure.
- Al Thomas came in to talk with Council about a potential service opportunity for Highland Church called, "Sleep in Heavenly Peace", an organization made up of local chapters to build beds for kids that may otherwise not have one. Council approved Al's request to establish a local chapter at Highland Church serving Osceola County.
