HIGHLAND CRC'S COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS:

- 1. Church Building Updates:
 - The North roof is scheduled to be redone late summer.
 - New windows were installed in the nursery. They should be much more energy efficient!
 - Council approved a bid of \$10,600 to replace the sidewalks by handicap parking, the playground, and front entrance. This is coming from the existing building fund which is specifically designated for these types of projects. This will happen after July 11.
 - The Deck on the northeast lawn is going to be removed after July 11. We have water seeping into a basement classroom and have to figure out why. We are hoping that retiling the downspouts along with new gutters after the new roof is installed should solve the problem. There is no plan in place to replace the deck.
 - **You will notice that the northeast lawn is going to go through some drastic improvements. Please be aware of any construction and mess as several projects are ongoing after July 11.
- 2. Existing Church Building Fund: Council must report once a year on this fund. We continue to take a collection once a month for this fund. The total balance of this fund is \$19,654.78. At the November congregation meeting we gave a five year plan for church building improvements:
 - 2024 Playground & 3 Nursery Windows
 - 2025 Concrete & Outside Deck
 - 2026 Roof over East Wing
 - 2027 Fellowship Hall Floor
 - 2028 Siding for Church.
 - **You will notice that because of leaks, needs and financial ability that several projects are being done this year instead and one project is being delayed. We have not yet relooked at a five year plan but will do so later this fall.
- 3. It was noted that Pastor's Mark will be gone to Synod from June 13 to June 20. Classis has funds to cover pulpit supply for pastors serving at Synod. The pastors will take their first vacation the week of June 24 to July 1st.
- 4. A service opportunity in the community was discussed. The clerk and chair of the service team will coordinate.
- 5. Mutual Censure took place
