#### PRAYING FOR OUR KIDS

[Parachin, Victor M; Christian Home School; March/April 2002; pgs. 21-23]:

One of the most important things that we can do as parents is to pray for our children. Here is a collection of prayers, one for each day of the month. (See bulletins 8/18-9/8 for complete collection)

- 8. To have Spiritual stability O God, in times of moral uncertainty and temptation, empower my children to maintain their relationship with you. May they heed these words of Joshua: "You are to hold fast to the Lord our God" (Joshua 23:8).
- 9. To help bear burdens Loving God, encourage my children to reach out and help others who are dealing with pain or sadness. Through my example, may my children understand the importance of fulfilling the call of Scripture to "carry each other's burdens" (Galatians 6:2)
- 10. For spiritual and emotional growth Loving God, let my children be like Jesus, who "grew in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and men" (Luke 2:52)
- 11. For protection Almighty God, as my children go out this day, may your loving protection go ahead of the, follow behind them, hover over them, and stand beside them. This day and every day, protect them from danger, disease and trauma.
- 12. For faith in times of difficulty Dear God, whenever my children face trouble or temptations, let them turn to you for guidance and strength. Help them to remember your powerful promise: "The eternal God is your refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms" (Deuteronomy 33:27)
- 13. For contentment Loving God, cultivate in my children the kind of contentment described by the apostle Paul, who said, "I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret o being content in any and every situation, whether we fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want" (Philippians 4:12)
- 14. To be unselfish Gracious God, give my children more love, more self-denial, and more willingness to sacrifice for others. Let them understand deeply that it is more blessed to give than to receive.
