PRAYING FOR OUR KIDS

[Parachin, Victor M; Christian Home School; March/April 2002; pgs. 21-23]:

One of the most important things that we can do as parents is to pray for our children. Here is a collection of prayers, one for each day of the month. (See bulletins 8/18-9/8 for complete collection)

- 22. **To be free from materialism** Gracious God, let my children be free from the love of money. May they enjoy their benefits, privileges, and material blessings without clamoring for more and more; and if they are blessed with wealth in their adult years, cause them to use their abundance to advance your kingdom.
- 23. **For compassion** Eternal God, nurture in my children a love for the many unfortunate people who live in poverty and misery. Arouse in their hearts a deep and abiding empathy for persons with severe disabilities.
- 24. **To be filled with hope-** Loving God, no matter what may befall my children, may they be so filled with hope that it prevents despair from taking hold. With the apostle I pray that "the God of hope" will fill them with all joy and peace (Romans 15:13)
- 25. **For perseverance-** Dear God, keep my children from becoming impatient and quitting prematurely. Develop within them endurance and perseverance so that when they face major challenges and crises, they don't easily give up or give in. Let my children be "Joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer" (Romans 12:12)
- 26. For a passionate love of God- Gracious God, cultivate in my children a passion to love and serve you. May my children have the same kind of enthusiastic love for you as did David, who wrote, "I will praise you, O Lord, with all my heart; I will tell of all your wonders. I will be glad and rejoice in you" (Psalm 9:1-2)
- 27. **To Forgive** Eternal God, fill my children with the spirit of forgiveness. Whenever they are hurt, may they naturally forgive and turn from resentment. Help them to take seriously the apostle Paul's instruction, "Forgive as the Lord forgave you" (Colossians 3:13)
- 28. **To Have a teachable spirit** Gracious God, enable each of my children to realize that they don't know it all. May they learn better patience, greater love, and more compassion from the example of other people who are your servants.
- 29. **For the wise use of talents** Loving God, thank you for filling my children with numerous gifts, talents, and abilities. As they mature, give them wisdom to find ways to use their gifts to help others.
- 30. **To Practice hospitality** Eternal God, may my children be open and welcoming to all others. May they be the ones who reach out, embracing those who need a friend.
- 31. **To be faithful in prayer-** Gracious and loving God, help my children to live lives punctuated by prayer so that they "pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests" (Ephesians 6:18) Give them persistence and power in their praying.
